She feels distant from him as he won't accept her friend request on social media and doesn't talk with her at home, shown by a rhetorical question 'Who can I talk to?'. She also repeats 'I don't understand' to highlight her frustration at her son.

Sample answer:

Jooyong is very likely to continue living in Australia. Although he finds living in Australia a little inconvenient compared to Korea, with shops closing early and frequent public transport delays, he wants to stay to continue studying English. Living in Australia is vital for his dream of becoming a hotel manager, as there is a famous hotel school, and he will be paid better than in Korea. Lastly, he's likely to stay with his girlfriend in Australia.

Sample answer:

Hyunwoo's parents had a positive impact on his life, as they acknowledged his dislike for studying and advised him to go to Germany on a working holiday. As a result, he found joy in meeting new people from different cultures and started working as a travel agent. He is now successful with his own travel agency.

Sample answer:

Hajeong's advice is more useful as she addresses Chaerin's question about the benefits of working holidays and explains that her daughter will be able to broaden her world view. She provides advice on improving Chaerin's relationship with her daughter by telling her to listen and respect her daughter's opinion. She also suggests speaking on the phone often while her daughter is abroad to ensure her safety. On the other hand, Jimin only advises to let her daughter take responsibility as an adult, which would not relieve Chaerin of her specific concerns.

Sooyoung was highly successful, as his assistance allowed the elderly couple to employ useful business tools to become the highest earning store in the market. This also improved their health, as they were now able to afford better doctors and medication. By helping them to understand new words and use social media sites, the elderly couple were also able to regain a sense of connection with the younger generation.

Sample answer:

Sooyoung reveals a caring and warm attitude towards the elderly. The exaggeration in the line 'even though it took a thousand years to teach them new things I made sure to visit them everyday to check on their progress' shows his dedication and commitment to helping the elderly. He felt like he had 'done something great' from helping the elderly couple and this has also allowed him to 'live more joyfully'. He uses emotive language such as 'so inspiring', 'so heart-warming' and 'so proud' to reveal his deep sense of respect towards the elderly for overcoming their struggles.
